Student Edition

Student Editions engage learners so they interact with text and connected activities. They also serve as a dynamic record of student work and progress. Both the consumable print and digital editions give students multiple prompts, ample room for student work, and include links and references to additional supporting materials.

Performance-Based Assessments

A variety of assessments measure student progress and inform instruction:

- Embedded Assessments give students performance-based opportunities to demonstrate mastery of skills and knowledge visually, orally and in writing.
 Each unit begins by unpacking these assessments to identify the skills and knowledge students will develop.
- Scoring Guides set clear expectations for student scores.
- Student Reflections and Portfolio at the end of each unit encourage selfassessment and help students identify strategies that worked for them as they take real ownership of their learning.

 Unit Assessments are customizable and contain the College Board's highquality test items with rationales that explain why answers are correct or incorrect.

 PARCC and SBAC item types are now included in all Unit Assessments to give students and educators experience with the newly developed Common Core assessment approaches.


